Dear families,


We work hard at Snettisham Primary School to make sure we have a broad curriculum that covers not only learning but wider personal development. We have strong provision for personal development at our school with planned and spontaneous experiences, roles and responsibilities open to all our pupils. Most of these experiences are covered over the time we have at school – starting with EYFS and moving through to KS2 . OAK CLASS

Oak class have had an incredibly productive half-term! During PSHE, our children formed an interview panel and put together questions for interviewees to answer. We had some fantastic interviews and I'm pleased to tell you that all candidates were successful! Our Chinese art unit inspired the children to create some wonderful impressions of tree blossom and nature, using centre, side and grass strokes. Within Science we were tasked with calculating the density of various materials. Do ask you child why some object float and some sink in water, or about Newtonian and Non-Newtonian fluids - I'm sure they will impress you with their knowledge. PE has comprised of some very competitive netball games, plus we have participated in a webinar with an RAF pilot, written a tale of fear and mastered fractions, decimals and percentages. Phew! Have a well-deserved half-term everyone.

WILLOW CLASS

We have had a very busy start to the Spring Term and I cannot believe that I have been with your lovely children for a whole term already! It has been amazing getting to know their personalities over the last few weeks and I look forward to next term. Year 1's really enjoyed our English texts about 'The Crow and the Peacock' and the book 'Mixed' which we have linked to including everybody and being different is okay as we are all unique. We have been learning about Length and Height and Mass and Volume in Maths. Reception children have been learning all about Kings, Queens and Countries. They have really enjoyed pretending to be Kings and Queens and writing about where they might like to go in London! In Maths we have been looking at addition and subtraction and number bonds to 10! They have also loved their story of 'Quackling' even though it was quite long they did amazing at remembering and retelling!

I just want to say a massive thank you to all of you for being so supportive, kind and welcoming over the last few weeks.









Our Learning (cont'd)

BIRCH CLASS

Birch Class has had a super busy term! We started with the trip of a lifetime to London Parliament! The children went on a tour around the House of Lords and Commons to see where all the laws and decisions are made for this country. The children have performed weekly experiments in science, learning all about solids, liquids and gases. They made oobleck out of cornstarch and discovered it was both a solid and liquid. We have been learning about the French Revolution in History. The class has studied the lives of King Louis and Marie Antoinette and why the French people wanted to overthrow them. As well as understanding who Nelson and Napoleon were and why they are still relevant today.

They have performed excellently when learning the rules of Netball and have made some amazing passes and shots. Their artwork of Chinese cherry blossoms was incredible and they thoroughly enjoyed painting and grinding with ink. Birch class were lucky enough to link their learning of Islam to a visit to Peterborough Mosque, a beautiful building with a fantastic talk about their religion from the local Imam. Altogether, an excellent start to the new year. Well done everyone!

ASH CLASS

It's been a great and busy start to 2024 in Ash Class. In Maths, the children have been learning about shape and measures, as well as fractions which they have made a fantastic start with. In English we enjoyed the beautiful book 'Neverbelieve' by Norman Messenger and used it to help us write about a new creature. In Science the children have learnt about rocks, fossils and soils. We loved making our own fossils using salt dough. We even carried out an experiment to test the permeability of soil! Swimming for Ash Class has finished for the year, it has been wonderful to see their confidence and abilities increase week on week. Many children managed a whole length of the pool and on our final session we had fun on the slides!





The importance of good attendance

The Government strives for every pupil to achieve 97% attendance. Every day away from school is a day away from learning and this can have an impact on a child's education and future accomplishments.

We want every child to enjoy school and achieve their potential in education and life beyond. We are always here to talk through any issues and help find solutions. Parents are always a phone call away if a child is too ill to continue their day, please encourage them to try to give the day a go, children often feel much better once they are in class.

The Government has issued new attendance guidance and targets to all schools, you may receive regular texts informing you of the number of days that your child has been absent in a term/year. The Government hope that this personal approach will make parents more aware of how the odd day adds up and help keep you informed.

Vouchers for Free School Meal Eligible Pupils – April 2023 to March 2024

Support has been extended until March 2024 for pupils eligible for means-tested Free School Meals (FSM). Families who are eligible for Free School Meals will receive Edenred vouchers for April to August next month and then more in September. The vouchers can be spent at many major retailers including supermarkets.

Families in hardship and needing wider support In addition to the offer of FSM vouchers for eligible families, there is support available for families who are facing hardship and need support. Anyone experiencing hardship may be able to receive support through the Norfolk Assistance Scheme (NAS), which may be able to provide support for food, fuel, clothes and other essential household items to families experiencing hardship. Families may get in touch with NAS via their website which includes an online application form, or they can call **0344 800 8020**.

Have your circumstances changed recently? You may be eligible for Free School Meals.
