Homework challenge – Autumn Term 2 2025

We would like children to select at least two of the homework challenges below for this term, however children can do as many as they wish. This will continue to run alongside the regular reading and we also encourage the children to use Times Tables Rockstars which has been purchased for them.

<p>History- The Birth of the British Empire</p> <p>Create a timeline showing at least 5 key events or countries that became part of the Empire between the 1500s and 1800s.</p>	<p>Science- Chemistry</p> <p>Carry out a kitchen science investigation to explore reversible and irreversible changes. Choose 3 examples from around your home (e.g. melting chocolate, baking bread, dissolving sugar in water)..</p>	<p>Geography- Mountains</p> <p>Create an information poster about a famous mountain or mountain range (e.g. the Alps, the Himalayas, or Snowdonia).</p> <p>Create a 3D mountain model.</p>
<p>Computing – Video editing</p> <p>Create a short 1–2 minute video about something you enjoy (a hobby, your pet, a “day in the life”, or a school subject). Use any video editing software or app (like iMovie, Clipchamp, or CapCut).</p>	<p>Art- African Art</p> <p>Research and create a piece of African-inspired art. This could be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A tribal mask using cardboard or recycled materials • A patterned textile design using bold colours and shapes • A painting inspired by African landscapes or animals 	<p>PSHE- Celebrating difference</p> <p>Create a poster or short written piece celebrating what makes people different and unique. You could include examples of different cultures, abilities, or interests and why these differences make communities stronger.</p> <p>You could:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Draw people showing different talents • Write a poem or short story about inclusion • Interview a family member about what makes them unique

The challenge work is due in on the **11th December** and we will spend time looking at and celebrating their work. The above menu details a range of work for the subjects that your child will cover this term.

Children can think about how they would like to present their work.

It would be nice if the children have a go at this homework so they all have something to share at the end of each half term.
