

Our Year 5 and 6 pupils were pleased to be invited to St Mary's Church on 22nd February to take part in the launch of the 'Snettisham 45' remembrance project. The project intends to re-affirm the village's commitment to honour and remember its 45 fallen during WWI by laying wreaths, tributes and letters written by our pupils on the graves of all the men, covering 25 sites across 7 countries and 3 continents. The launch event was supported by the Lord Lieutenant of Norfolk and the Mayor of Kings Lynn, as well as many other members of our local community.

Outside the church, the children watched respectfully as Reverend Wilson led an act of remembrance at the graves of two of the 45 - Sidney Mitchell and Jacob Flatt. Kian and Ruby laid letters they had written to the soldiers thanking them for their bravery and elaborating on the many changes to the village over the last 100 years.

The project to remember the 45 will culminate in a service of remembrance at St Mary's on 11th November.
