Our Learning

OAK CLASS

We have had another busy half term in Oak class! We have been working on fractions in Maths and persevering when adding, subtracting, ordering and comparing fractions! We have also developed our knowledge of converting units and ratio which all the children did really well with. In English, we finished our Suffragette biography work and have since been studying discursive texts using the novel 'Stay Where You Are and Then Leave.' We have been learning all about Suffragettes in History; the NUWSS and the WSPU. This unit, along with our English work, have led to passionate debating. In our art lesson, we have been looking at the Renaissance and have studied artists like Michelangelo and Leonardo di Vinci. We sketched eyes (after studying the Mona Lisa), drew landscapes using perspective and created sun discs which we have painted – they look really effective! The last few weeks of this half term have been really busy – carol singing at The Close, the pantomime, Christmas jumper day and our trip to the Sainsbury Centre! We are so proud of the Year 6s; they are kind, helpful and hardworking and we hope you all have a wonderful Christmas!

WILLOW CLASS

Merry Christmas everyone! It has been a brilliant but busy half term and the children have been working so hard. We can see so much progress in all areas of development. Both Reception and Year 1 children had a visit from ZooLab as well as Mrs McQuade's kittens. The children were so respectful, I was very proud of all of them. The Year 1 children have been working on learning teen numbers to 20. In English we are learning the model text 'Animals and their needs' which is a non-fiction text so we have been learning facts about different animals. The children have done a fabulous job at writing their own versions of the story this week! Ms Jackson came to have a look and was extremely impressed!

The Reception children have been working on their handwriting and learning their sounds. They have been learning the Model Text 'The Three Little Pigs' and last week changed the characters and retold their own story which both the children and I were super proud of! We have been practising counting to 20 which they are superstars at now. In knowledge the topic is 'Lights and Celebrations' we made Diva lamps and have looked at different ways people celebrate Christmas around the world.

Children know how their bodies prepare to eat as well as the organs that help to process our foods and the importance of eating a balanced diet. Trips have included a tour of the Anglo Saxon village at West Stow, the King's Lynn annual pantomime and a fantastic performance of Chitty Chitty Bang Bang by the students of Smithdon High School. The importance of good attendance

The Government strives for every pupil to achieve 97% attendance. Every day away from school is a day away from learning and this can have an impact on a child's education and future accomplishments.

We want every child to enjoy school and achieve their potential in education and life beyond. We are always here to talk through any issues and help find solutions. Parents are always a phone call away if a child is too ill to continue their day, please encourage them to try to give the day a go, children often feel much better once they are in class.

The Government has issued new attendance guidance and targets to all schools, you may receive regular texts informing you of the number of days that your child has been absent in a term/year. The Government hope that this personal approach will make parents more aware of how the odd day adds up and help keep you informed.

Vouchers for Free School Meal Eligible Pupils – April 2024 to March 2025

Support has been extended until March 2025 for pupils eligible for means-tested Free School Meals (FSM). Families who are eligible for Free School Meals will receive Edenred vouchers for April to August next month and then more in September. The vouchers can be spent at many major retailers including supermarkets.

Families in hardship and needing wider support In addition to the offer of FSM vouchers for eligible families, there is support available for families who are facing hardship and need support. Anyone experiencing hardship may be able to receive support through the Norfolk Assistance Scheme (NAS), which may be able to provide support for food, fuel, clothes and other essential household items to families experiencing hardship. Families may get in touch with NAS via their website which includes an online application form, or they can call **0344 800 8020**.

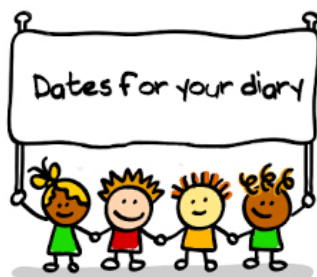

PUNCTUALITY MATTERS!

Being frequently late for school adds up to lost learning:

- Arriving 5 minutes late every day adds up to over 3 days lost each year.
- Arriving 15 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 2 weeks a year.
- Arriving 30 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 19 days a year.

19 days lost a year through being late means 90% attendance.
