OAK CLASS

Year 6 Summer 1

Wow! What a half term! Oak have worked so hard during SATs week. It was great to see so many in Breakfast Club for pain au chocolat, pancakes, toast and bacon sandwiches! We are so proud of them for the hard work they put in! It was lovely to finish the week with a Funday Friday! We have also enjoyed more fascinating units of work across the curriculum. In Art we have been studying the Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood and recreated paintings such as 'Ophelia' and 'Light of the World.' In Geography, we have studied Britain and discussed important issues such as climate change, air pollution and litter. We have become experts on the human body after looking at the different systems in Science such as our nervous system, circulatory system, muscular system and digestive system. Oak have also developed an incredible understanding of the Cold War in history – their knowledge and ability to explain events during this period of history is amazing! We also had a great trip to 'Crucial Crew' where we learnt how to keep ourselves safe. We are looking forward to half term and all the exciting events happening in the second half of the summer term.



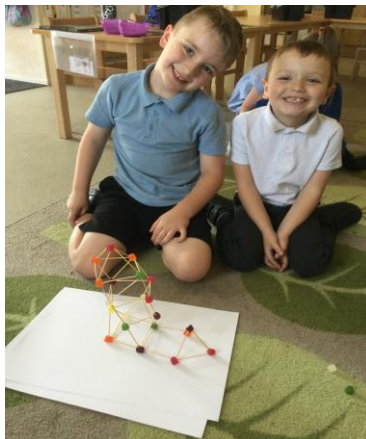
Our Learning (cont'd)

WILLOW CLASS

The children in Willow Class have been super busy this half term once again! Every single child has been working incredibly hard and putting in their best effort every day when completing their learning. The Reception children have been learning about Growing and Changing. They have been learning about lifecycles and how things grow in our world. We currently caterpillars in our classroom which we are very interested in watching and learning how they change as they grow. They have loved playing the garden this half term and have been busy with many different activities over the last few weeks! They have been learning the text 'The Enormous Turnip' and are changing the characters to their own ready to create their own version of the story next week!

The Year 1 children have been learning the text 'At the End of the Rainbow' and are about to innovate and think about their own characters for the story. Their handwriting is incredible and they should be so proud of what they have achieved. In maths we have covered a lot of different topics over the last few weeks including position and direction, place value within 100 and fractions! We have been practicing our phonics lots this half term and we have made some amazing progress. The children have loved the DT this half term as it was about Freestanding Structures so have been designing and building their own structures and bridges!

BIRCH CLASS

Birch have worked really hard this half term. In Geography, we have studied our environment and how we need to look after it; it's been interesting learning all about food air miles! In Science we have learnt about electricity, how to build complete circuits and what materials are conductors and insulators. We have really enjoyed History half term as we have been investigating leisure and entertainment. This has included learning about the history of holidays, how film and television developed and music and how we have gone from record players to apps like Spotify. We also enjoyed learning about this history of sport. Art with Miss Scott has been fun; learning about 'Style in Art' and focusing on rococo style and modernist pieces like the Wassily chair - we loved having a go at creating our own chairs in the hall using tape! We have also just started dance lessons which we look forward to continuing after half term.

ASH CLASS

The shortest and probably busiest half term so far! In English we learnt about biographies. We learnt about Malala Yousafzai, a Pakistani activist for girls education and then researched Ibtihaj Muhhamad, the first muslim-American to wear a hijab at the olympics. In Maths, we have worked very hard at telling the time and even managed to master digital time too! We have loved our science work on electricity, and found that the more bulbs you add to a circuit, the duller each bulb got. We also carried out an investigation to find out which materials were conductors and which were insulators of electricity. We all enjoyed computing work this half term, particularly learning how to create an algorithm and debug it if it went wrong. Some children even managed to beat my score in the home learning beebot activity! Have a great half term and I look forward to all our learning in the last half term of the school year.

The importance of good attendance

The Government strives for every pupil to achieve 97% attendance. Every day away from school is a day away from learning and this can have an impact on a child's education and future accomplishments.

We want every child to enjoy school and achieve their potential in education and life beyond. We are always here to talk through any issues and help find solutions. Parents are always a phone call away if a child is too ill to continue their day, please encourage them to try to give the day a go, children often feel much better once they are in class.

The Government has issued new attendance guidance and targets to all schools, you may receive regular texts informing you of the number of days that your child has been absent in a term/year. The Government hope that this personal approach will make parents more aware of how the odd day adds up and help keep you informed.

Vouchers for Free School Meal Eligible Pupils – April 2025 to March 2026

Support has been extended until March 2026 for pupils eligible for means-tested Free School Meals (FSM). Families who are eligible for Free School Meals will receive Edenred vouchers for April to August next month and then more in September. The vouchers can be spent at many major retailers including supermarkets.

Families in hardship and needing wider support In addition to the offer of FSM vouchers for eligible families, there is support available for families who are facing hardship and need support. Anyone experiencing hardship may be able to receive support through the Norfolk Assistance Scheme (NAS), which may be able to provide support for food, fuel, clothes and other essential household items to families experiencing hardship. Families may get in touch with NAS via their website which includes an online application form, or they can call **0344 800 8020**.

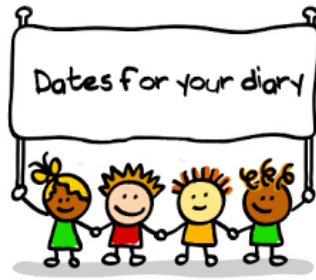

- Arriving 30 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 19 days a year.

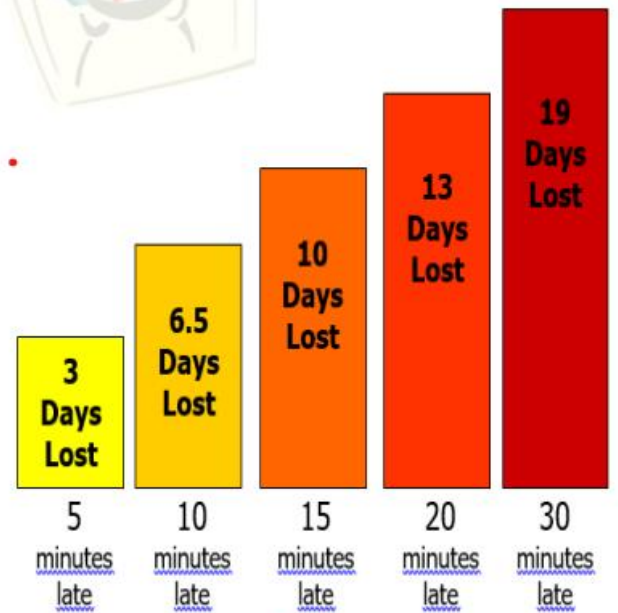
