OAK CLASS

What a busy, productive half-term Oak Class have had: a trip to Hilltop Activity Centre; a graduation event at Cambridge University's Faculty of English; and a Geography field trip, as well as hot writes, swimming lessons and assessments! Oak Class have made great progress during our weekly swimming lessons and have really enjoyed taking part together. During Science, we have been learning all about the five layers of the atmosphere and how pollutants, deforestation and agriculture have contributed to Climate Change. Our local field study gave all children the opportunity to investigate land use within Snettisham and surrounding areas, aiding our understanding of how we use land for residential, commercial and recreational purposes. And what a successful trip to Hilltop! I saw some amazing photographs of children tackling the Tree Top Challenge, a huge zipwire and having a dip in the outdoor swimming pool. Oak Class have had a fantastic year that they should be incredibly proud of. I wish Oak Class a successful Year 7 at high school and all of our lovely families a wonderful, relaxing summer break.

WILLOW CLASS

Where has the time gone!? I cannot believe that we are in our last few weeks of school before summer holidays. We have been super busy once again!

The Year 1's have been loving learning the text 'How to make Fairy Dust' and are in the process of creating their own version of the story. They have also loved the book 'How to find Gold' which was our High Quality Text. We have been learning time, money and recapping out previous knowledge of place value within 50. The Year 1's have been super lucky this half term and have been to 2 sports festivals which they enjoyed thoroughly but also were role models to other schools! They have loved learning about Magnets and Materials in Science. I think it's safe to say their favourite part was discovering that magnets attract and repel each other, they found it very funny! I wish them all the very best for Year 2 learning, they will be superstars!

The Reception children have been learning the text 'The Rainbow Princess' which they have loved retelling and adding their own actions. Over the last few weeks they have been creating their own characters to put into the story using their very own rhyming words. In maths they have been learning the days of the week, 2D shapes and 3D shapes. They have been working extremely hard and on days where the Year 1's have been at sports events they have been pretending to be the Year 1 children! The children have been learning all about 'The Sea' they have loved using clay, playing outside and in the sand.

Lastly we completed our sponsored walk... we went round the playground 27 laps each, which meant we did 449 laps altogether!

The importance of good attendance

The Government strives for every pupil to achieve 97% attendance. Every day away from school is a day away from learning and this can have an impact on a child's education and future accomplishments.

We want every child to enjoy school and achieve their potential in education and life beyond. We are always here to talk through any issues and help find solutions. Parents are always a phone call away if a child is too ill to continue their day, please encourage them to try to give the day a go, children often feel much better once they are in class.

The Government has issued new attendance guidance and targets to all schools, you may receive regular texts informing you of the number of days that your child has been absent in a term/year. The Government hope that this personal approach will make parents more aware of how the odd day adds up and help keep you informed.

Vouchers for Free School Meal Eligible Pupils – April 2023 to March 2024

Support has been extended until March 2024 for pupils eligible for means-tested Free School Meals (FSM). Families who are eligible for Free School Meals will receive Edenred vouchers for April to August next month and then more in September. The vouchers can be spent at many major retailers including supermarkets.

Families in hardship and needing wider support In addition to the offer of FSM vouchers for eligible families, there is support available for families who are facing hardship and need support. Anyone experiencing hardship may be able to receive support through the Norfolk Assistance Scheme (NAS), which may be able to provide support for food, fuel, clothes and other essential household items to families experiencing hardship. Families may get in touch with NAS via their website which includes an online application form, or they can call **0344 800 8020**.

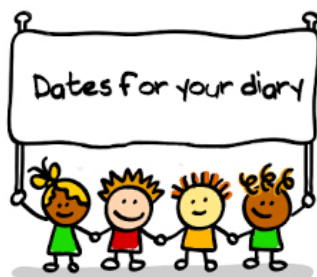

- Arriving 30 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 19 days a year.

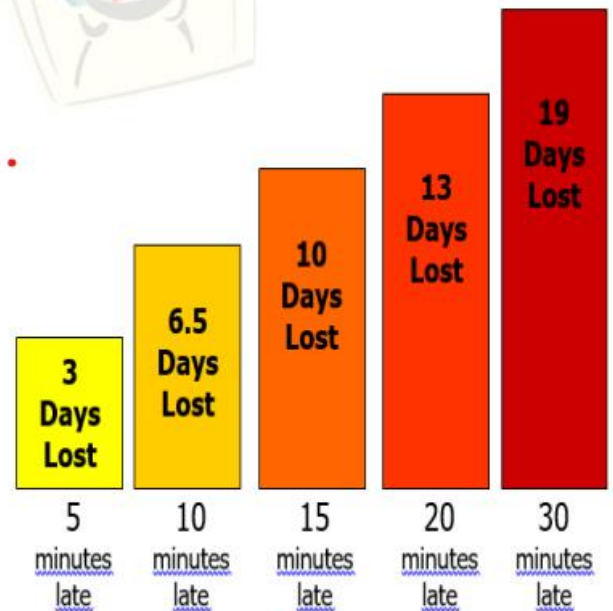
19 days lost a year through being late means 90% attendance.
