Dear Parents

It has been a busy half term as usual with plenty of learning, trips, activities and clubs planned into the first half of the summer term. As we move towards to the end of the year, it is wonderful to see how each class is ready for the next stage in their development. So, we are planning and organising transition times across the school with a Move Up and Stay Up period at the end of term. This will help each child meet their new teacher and be within their new class environment. We find this helps pupils to be really positive over the holiday about returning in September. Details will be shared across schools after the break.

In the last few weeks we have invited families into school to join in with our life skills curriculum. These have been brilliant! Pupils and staff really enjoyed this and we hope you did too. 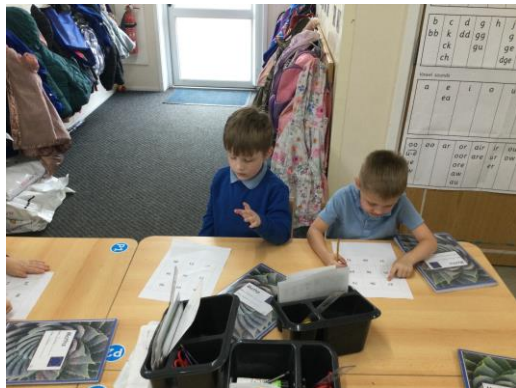
Our Learning

WILLOW CLASS

The children in Willow Class have been super busy this half term once again! Every single child has been working incredibly hard and putting in their best effort every day when completing their learning. The Reception children have been learning about Growing and Changing. They have been learning about lifecycles and how things grow in our world. We currently have both tadpoles and caterpillars in our classroom which we are very interested in watching and learning how they change as they grow. They have loved playing the garden this half term and have been busy with many different activities over the last few weeks! They have been learning the text 'The Enormous Turnip' and have changed the characters to their own ready to create their own version of the story next week!

The Year 1 children have been learning the text 'At the End of the Rainbow' and have completed their Hot Writes which blew Mrs Watson away when she came in for a sneak peek! They have also been working hard on their handwriting this half term and we can see so much improvement which is great. In maths we have covered a lot of different topics over the last few weeks including position and direction, place value within 100 and fractions! We have been practicing our phonics lots this half term and we have made some amazing progress. The children have loved the DT this half term as it was about Freestanding Structures so have been designing and building their own structures and bridges!

Everyone in Willow has been working incredibly hard and I am so proud of the progress they are making!

BIRCH CLASS

What a fantastic summer 1 in Birch Class! The children have worked hard in all areas of the curriculum. They have produced some amazing moving toys in their DT projects and made merry go rounds spin using computer programming. They were very proud of their hot writes where they wrote a diary entry describing their escape from the flooded 'Eels Island'. After learning about Australia, we have learnt all about the island of New Zealand including its rare species of bird, the All Blacks and the Maori. We have been learning all about the industrial revolution during the Victorian age in our history lessons. This included children's jobs, the steam engine and what it was like living and working in the cities and factories. Linking with this topic, we had the opportunity to visit Gressenhall on a 'Victorian Day'. The children took part in farm work, trying drop scones and experiencing a Victorian classroom. All together a busy and exciting term. Well done!

This half term has been incredibly busy in Ash Class. There has been so much wonderful learning and fantastic work produced. After learning our model text about Dragons we wrote our own explanations in English for 'Why orangutans are critically endangered.' In History we learnt about the War of the Roses. So much fantastic acting was seen during this unit – we had several Kings, family disputes and even a murder to explore and learn about. In Science we've learnt about light and enjoyed learning why our shadows change throughout the day. We had a brilliant trip to Gressenhall where we learnt about a child's life in the workhouse and in a Victorian school classroom. Have a wonderful half term break, I can't wait to see what learning is ahead of us in our final half term of the school year!

Attendance Matters



The importance of good attendance

The Government strives for every pupil to achieve 97% attendance. Every day away from school is a day away from learning and this can have an impact on a child's education and future accomplishments.

We want every child to enjoy school and achieve their potential in education and life beyond. We are always here to talk through any issues and help find solutions. Parents are always a phone call away if a child is too ill to continue their day, please encourage them to try to give the day a go, children often feel much better once they are in class.

The Government has issued new attendance guidance and targets to all schools, you may receive regular texts informing you of the number of days that your child has been absent in a term/year. The Government hope that this personal approach will make parents more aware of how the odd day adds up and help keep you informed.

Vouchers for Free School Meal Eligible Pupils – April 2023 to March 2024

Support has been extended until March 2024 for pupils eligible for means-tested Free School Meals (FSM). Families who are eligible for Free School Meals will receive Edenred vouchers for April to August next month and then more in September. The vouchers can be spent at many major retailers including supermarkets.

Families in hardship and needing wider support In addition to the offer of FSM vouchers for eligible families, there is support available for families who are facing hardship and need support. Anyone experiencing hardship may be able to receive support through the Norfolk Assistance Scheme (NAS), which may be able to provide support for food, fuel, clothes and other essential household items to families experiencing hardship. Families may get in touch with NAS via their website which includes an online application form, or they can call **0344 800 8020**.

Have your circumstances changed recently? You may be eligible for Free School Meals.

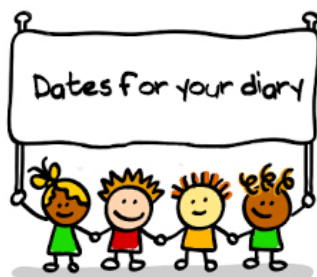

Being frequently late for school adds up to lost learning:

- Arriving 5 minutes late every day adds up to over 3 days lost each year.
- Arriving 15 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 2 weeks a year.
- Arriving 30 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 19 days a year.
