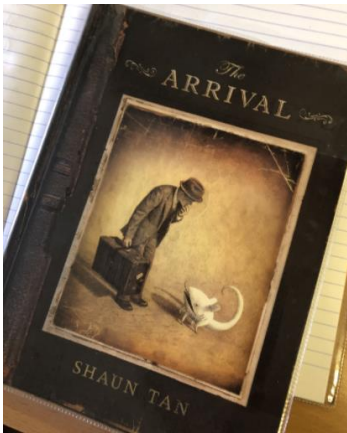

## Our Learning

### OAK CLASS

Year 6 have made a great start to the year. This half term in English we have been studying the book 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan which is a beautiful and very moving book with no words. It follows the story of a man who is an immigrant and how he builds a new life for himself and his family. Oak wrote amazing poetry using this book and our 'hot writes' were a meeting tale; they were really engaging stories, well done Oak! In Art, we enjoyed learning about William Morris and 'decorative arts'. Children designed and printed their own wallpaper using reduction printing techniques. In History, we have been learning about World War One, the causes, how it was fought and the consequences of the war. They have learnt all about the periodic table in Science and PE has also been thoroughly enjoyable this half term as we have also been going swimming at Oasis. In Maths we have worked on our arithmetic – learning about BODMAS was a particular highlight when we all got competitive during a challenge. Another main for this term is making sure that all children know all of their times tables (please keep working on these on Times Table Rockstars and SATs Companion) and also read as much as possible! Reading is so important, even just reading a few pages with an adult each day and answering a couple of questions will make such a difference!



## Our Learning (cont'd)

### WILLOW CLASS

Hello everyone, I cannot believe we have been back to school for 8 weeks already! I just want to start by saying that all of the children in Willow class have either settled into Reception or transitioned into Year 1 beautifully.

The Year 1 children have been working on addition and subtraction in maths, this has been a bit of challenge but we have worked through it well and we can see progress in their learning. We have also had a big focus on number bonds to 10 so if you ever get a spare 2 minutes please practise at home too! In English we are learning the model text 'Our Trip to the County Museum' which is a recount. The children will be writing their own version of this text after half term. They are currently really enjoying the High Quality Text 'Mr Gumpy's Outing' and made stick puppets which were used to retell the story to the Reception children. In Science we have been learning all about the Human Body. They have really enjoyed this half terms art which has been all about different types of lines, primary and secondary colours! Well done everyone! 😊

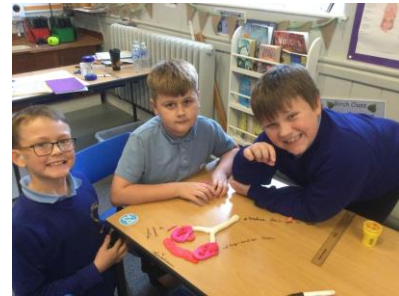
The Reception children have made a fantastic start to their learning journey. They have been busy exploring messy play, being creative, number work, letter work and much more! They have become experts at tidying up and have been working hard on being a team and helping everybody. They have been learning the Model Text 'Finding a Friend' and last week changed the characters and retold their own story which both the children and I were super proud of! They have made so much progress already and they are brilliant addition to Snettisham Primary School. In maths they have looked at subitising, grouping and learning to count and form numbers up to 5. In knowledge the topic is 'All about me' so we have been looking at who lives in your home, who is in our community and the types of houses we live in. We then went on a walk around the village to see the houses, we saw detached, semi-detached, terraced, bungalow and flats above the Co-op. 😊



## Our Learning (cont'd)

### BIRCH CLASS

This term in **Birch Class**, we've been busy exploring a wide range of exciting topics! In **Science**, we've been learning all about the **human body**, finishing the unit by creating our very own **playdough lungs** to help us understand how we breathe. In **Art**, we've been inspired by **Islamic art and architecture**, designing and painting **clay tiles** with beautiful repeating patterns, before taking our creativity outdoors to make large chalk designs on the playground. Our **Geography** topic, **Spatial Sense**, has helped us understand how maps represent the world around us — we even built **relief maps from LEGO** to show how colours indicate different elevations on 2D maps. We've also been hard at work preparing for our **Remembrance performance**, and it would be wonderful if the children could continue practising some of the songs at home, including *Run Rabbit Run*, *We'll Meet Again*, and *It's a Long Way to Tipperary*. Finally, in **Computing**, we've been learning about **sharing information and teamwork**, working in groups to complete challenges without speaking — a fun way to develop our communication and problem-solving skills!



## Our Learning (cont'd)

### ASH CLASS

We've had a great start to the year in Ash Class and it's been lovely to see the new year 2 and 3s working so well together. In English we learnt the story of 'Kassim and the Greedy Dragon.' We then followed the story structure to invent our own warning narratives. Ash Class have been working very hard on their handwriting, with lots of children now masters of joined letters! In Maths we've been developing our knowledge of addition and subtraction, and have found how important it is to practise the basics regularly - bonds to 10 and addition/subtraction within 20. Art has seen us create our own seascapes and natural artworks after being inspired by Turner and Goldsworthy. As scientists, we have explored plants and their lifecycles. A particular favourite activity was shaking the poppy seeds and dissecting a flower!

### Attendance Matters



### The importance of good attendance

The Government strives for every pupil to achieve 97% attendance. Every day away from school is a day away from learning and this can have an impact on a child's education and future accomplishments.

We want every child to enjoy school and achieve their potential in education and life beyond. We are always here to talk through any issues and help find solutions. Parents are always a phone call away if a child is too ill to continue their day, please encourage them to try to give the day a go, children often feel much better once they are in class.

The Government has issued new attendance guidance and targets to all schools, you may receive regular texts informing you of the number of days that your child has been absent in a term/year. The Government hope that this personal approach will make parents more aware of how the odd day adds up and help keep you informed.

### **Vouchers for Free School Meal Eligible Pupils – April 2025 to March 2026**

**Support has been extended until March 2026** for pupils eligible for means-tested Free School Meals (FSM). Families who are eligible for Free School Meals will receive Edenred vouchers for April to August next month and then more in September. The vouchers can be spent at many major retailers including supermarkets.

**Families in hardship and needing wider support** In addition to the offer of FSM vouchers for eligible families, there is support available for families who are facing hardship and need support. Anyone experiencing hardship may be able to receive support through the Norfolk Assistance Scheme (NAS), which may be able to provide support for food, fuel, clothes and other essential household items to families experiencing hardship. Families may get in touch with NAS via their website which includes an online application form, or they can call **0344 800 8020**.

- Arriving 30 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 19 days a year.

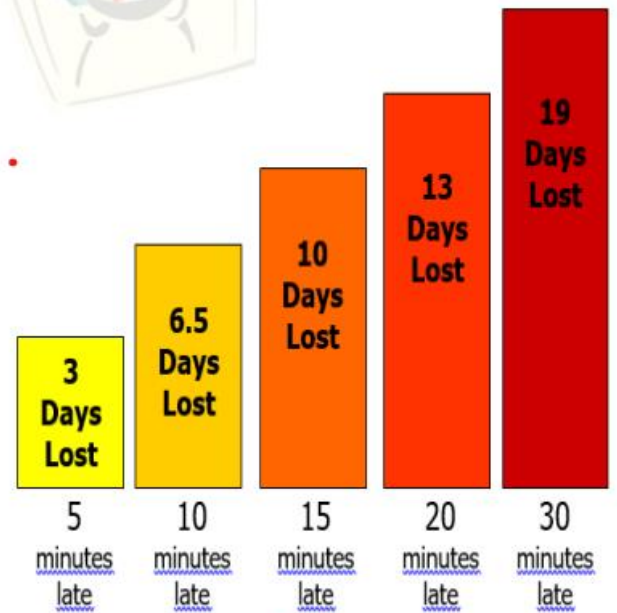
