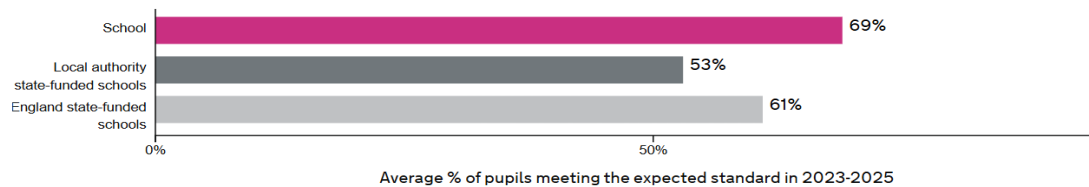
Dear Parents and Carers,

Good Achievement at Snettisham Primary School

The children in every class have worked hard throughout the Autumn Term and made good progress. Our recent assessments show us that our children are doing well. In addition, the DFE produce an annual report called "Compare School Performance" which details KS2 outcomes compared to local and national averages. 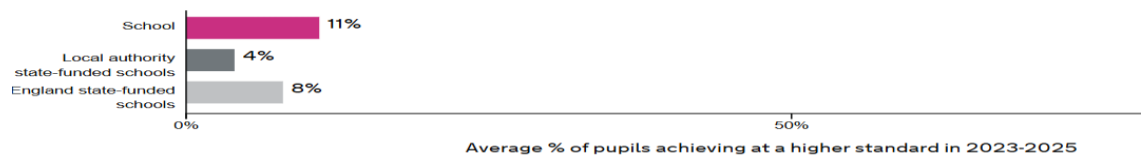
We are proud to share that for the last three years pupils from Snettisham Primary have performed above the average for all Norfolk Schools and for all school in England! See table below for pupils attaining the Expected Standard in Y6 for the last 3 years.

Our partner school Heacham Junior also has the same three-year trend at 69%, also above local and national averages. We are proud of our children, families and staff as achieving these outcomes puts children in a positive place as they move to high school and start to face their future lives. We are grateful for your support – your help at home with reading, tables and spellings make an enormous difference.

Our annual questionnaire has been positive too – we received 23 responses altogether and 100% of families would recommend our school. 100% of children feel safe and 95.7% feel children behave well. 92% say children are happy. The questionnaires show that any incidents of bullying are dealt with quickly. 100% of the families whose children have additional needs are happy with the support we give. 100% feel we have high expectations and the children do well. The question with the lowest response relates to clubs available. We will continue to review our offer for clubs. We are also increasing the information out to families by introducing a curriculum newsletter for the Spring Term in addition to sharing Knowledge Organisers and Newsletters. Our Learning

OAK CLASS

We have had another busy half term in Oak and also looking great in their new leavers hoodies! We have been working on fractions in Maths and persevering when adding, subtracting, ordering and comparing fractions! The children have done really well and their use of SATs Companion has helped their speed and accuracy of arithmetic questions. It is great to see almost all year 6s attending early morning booster sessions. In English, we finished our Suffragette biography work and have since been studying discursive texts using the novel 'Stay Where You Are and Then Leave.' We have been learning all about Suffragettes in History; the NUWSS and the WSPU. The children were all unanimous in their decision that they would have been militant activists if they had lived during this time! We used our learning to hold a few class debates which were fantastic! In our art lesson, we have been looking at the Renaissance and have studied artists like Michelangelo and Leonardo di Vinci. We sketched eyes (after studying the Mona Lisa), drew landscapes using perspective and created sun discs which we will paint before Christmas. One of the highlights of this half term was also our trip to the Sainsbury Centre in Norwich. We had time exploring the exhibitions and had a great time in a workshop creating our own vessels using modroc which were inspired by Hans Coper. We have enjoyed getting ready for Christmas by singing carols, preparing for the Christmas fair, our school Christmas dinner and the pantomime event. Have a great Christmas Oak class!

WILLOW CLASS

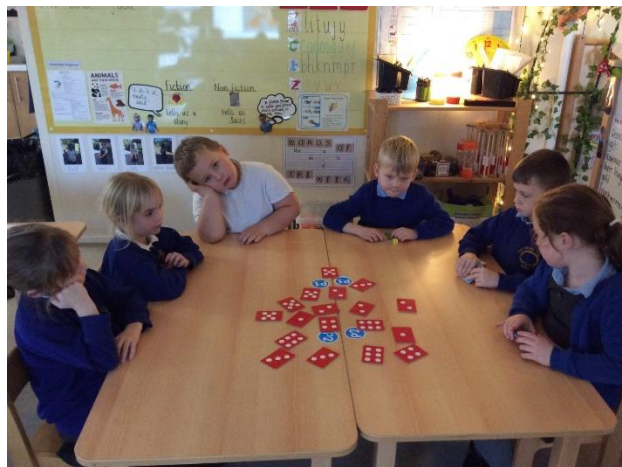
I cannot believe that we are nearly at the end of Autumn 2, the children in Willow class have made some incredible progress! 😊 We have been super busy practising the nativity and we are super excited to show off at the church.

The Year 1 children have been working on understanding number lines and how to estimate accurately. We also looked at shapes and if they are 2D or 3D. In English we are learning the model text 'Animals and their needs' which links seamlessly without science this half term. They have been working very hard on their handwriting and presentation too which has made their books look very neat and tidy.

The Reception children have been working on their handwriting and learning their sounds. They have been learning the Model Text 'The Three Little Pigs' and last week changed the characters and retold their own story which both the children and I were super proud of! We have been practising counting to 20 which they are superstars at now. In knowledge the topic is 'Lights and Celebrations' we made Diva lamps and have looked at different ways people celebrate Christmas around the world. 😊

BIRCH CLASS

In Birch Class this Autumn Term, we have been continuing to build our knowledge across the curriculum.

In Art, we explored African art and created our own relief pieces using corrugated card.

In Science, we have been learning about atomic structure, chemical reactions, and states of matter.

In PE, we have been developing our gymnastics skills by practising partner balances and routines. We were also fortunate to take part in an intraschool competition in darts and boccia (boules).

In PSHE, our discussions have focused on understanding and tackling bullying.

In RE, we have been looking at the different Christmas stories and even had the chance to ask Reverend Dan questions during his visit.

For our English topic, we have been writing portal stories and reading *The Chronicles of Narnia*. The children have particularly enjoyed taking turns reading the different roles in the book.

It was wonderful to see so many of you at the Christmas craft event, where we enjoyed making beautiful hanging stars together. I am very much looking forward to next term and seeing the children continue to grow and build their knowledge.

ASH CLASS

Another half term is nearing an end and this one has been particularly busy with lots of Christmas events, alongside our exciting curriculum, time has flown by! In English, we learnt the story of 'King Midas and the Golden Touch' and then created our own version of 'Sonny and the Christmassy Touch' before writing our own, very imaginative, wishing tales. In Maths, year 2s began learning their times tables and the year 3s extended their knowledge by learning the 3, 4 and 8x tables. We also completed our termly assessments in reading and maths, which the children loved and wished they could do more! Our foundation subject work has led us to learn about the water cycle, Western Europe, Esafety, Ancient Greece, gymnastics and sewing. Attendance Matters



The importance of good attendance

The Government strives for every pupil to achieve 97% attendance. Every day away from school is a day away from learning and this can have an impact on a child's education and future accomplishments.

We want every child to enjoy school and achieve their potential in education and life beyond. We are always here to talk through any issues and help find solutions. Parents are always a phone call away if a child is too ill to continue their day, please encourage them to try to give the day a go, children often feel much better once they are in class.

The Government has issued new attendance guidance and targets to all schools, you may receive regular texts informing you of the number of days that your child has been absent in a term/year. The Government hope that this personal approach will make parents more aware of how the odd day adds up and help keep you informed.

Vouchers for Free School Meal Eligible Pupils – April 2025 to March 2026

Support has been extended until March 2026 for pupils eligible for means-tested Free School Meals (FSM). Families who are eligible for Free School Meals will receive Edenred vouchers for April to August next month and then more in September. The vouchers can be spent at many major retailers including supermarkets.

Families in hardship and needing wider support In addition to the offer of FSM vouchers for eligible families, there is support available for families who are facing hardship and need support. Anyone experiencing hardship may be able to receive support through the Norfolk Assistance Scheme (NAS), which may be able to provide support for food, fuel, clothes and other essential household items to families experiencing hardship. Families may get in touch with NAS via their website which includes an online application form, or they can call **0344 800 8020**.

- Arriving 30 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 19 days a year.

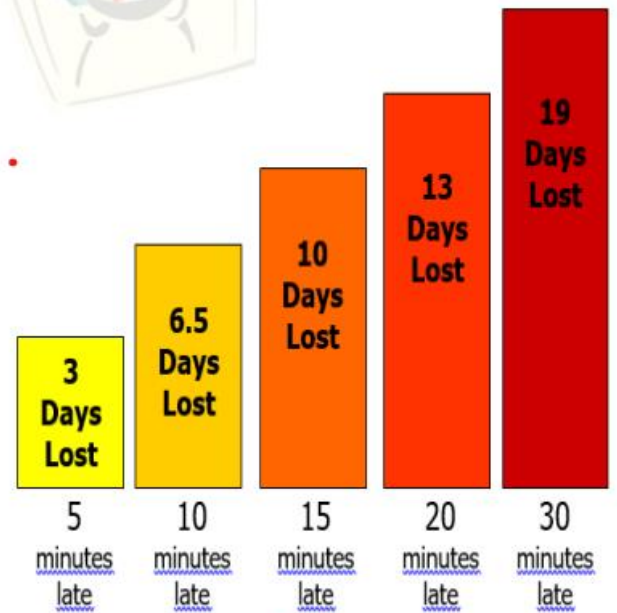
