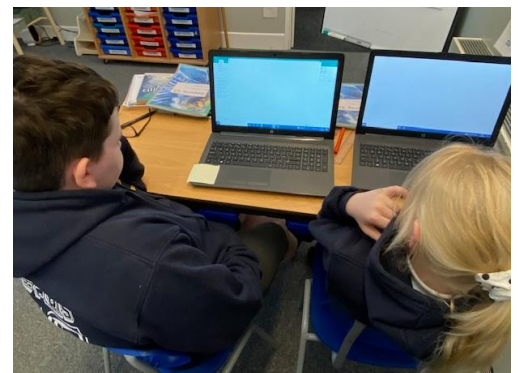

Our Learning

OAK CLASS

We started the spring term with algebra in maths – the children were fantastic at it! They could create equations from mathematical diagrams and solve them. We have also been going into more depths with decimals and percentages in Maths and have continued to develop our speed and fluency with arithmetic. SATs Companion and times table practise is really helping fluency with multiplication and other operations so keep it up Year 6! In English, we have used the book ‘Stay Where You Are and Then Leave’ and ‘Call of the Wild’. The children produced amazing pieces of written work when we were writing a discursive text. We have learnt about Nazi Germany and the lead up to World War Two in History, and in Science we have been learning about plants and have conducted a range of investigations to learn about all about them, including all about how capillary action works. Design and Technology lessons have been fantastic this half term. We have studied the Dyson company – did you know James Dyson comes from Cromer!? We became design engineers, and designed and built our own fan. The children created prototypes, which they had to keep adapting as challenges, and problems were found. Geography has been South America and it has been interesting learning about how diverse it is. We enjoyed our mini medics session and look forward to more experiences next half term.

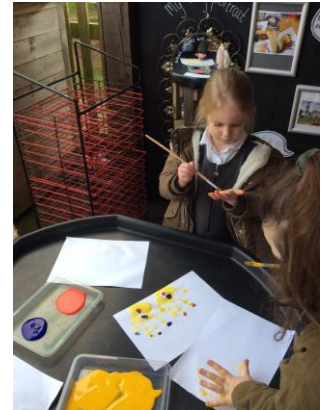
WILLOW CLASS

I cannot believe that we are nearly at the end of Spring 1, it has been a crazy but amazing few weeks and the children in Willow class have been fantastic! 😊

The Year 1 children have been working on learning length and height. We have been measuring each other as well as other objects in our classroom. In English we are learning the model text 'The crow and the peacock' which has taught us that we are all unique and we do not need to be like anyone else to be happy. Year 1's LOVED their DT unit this half term which has been 'Food Technology'. We have made smoothies! We have been keeping a track of how much it has rained over the last few weeks. We have made a rain gauge and the children check it each morning!

The Reception children have continued to work super hard on handwriting as well as their sound and blending knowledge! They have been learning the Model Text 'Quackling'. They have come up with some incredible ideas of their own for their new versions of the story too. We were super lucky to have a music and movement session all about Chinese New Year, the children were superstars whilst in the session. In knowledge the topic is 'Kings and Queens and Countries' and we have been looking at the crown jewels and who our past monarchs were.

BIRCH CLASS

Birch Class have had a fantastic Spring 1 term and have been working incredibly hard across the curriculum. It was great to see so many parents and careers in for TTrackstar day.

In English, the children have been developing their storytelling skills by learning how to create fear and suspense. They have focused on *showing* the reader rather than *telling*, building tension through carefully chosen language.

In Maths, the Year 4 pupils have made great progress with their Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) scores, with some children doubling their results since the autumn term – a brilliant achievement!

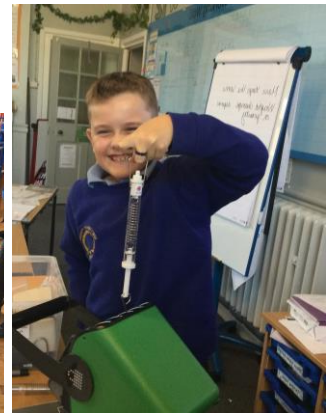
In Science, Birch Class have been exploring states of matter. They have carried out a range of exciting experiments, some of which are shown in the photos below.

In History, the children have been learning about the French Revolution and key historical figures such as Nelson and Napoleon. They have also developed their skills in interpreting historical sources to help them understand the past.

Birch Class also enjoyed an excellent trip to Cambridge, where they learned about Benin art. Back in school, they have been exploring Chinese art, experimenting with different brushes and brush strokes to create beautiful cherry blossom artwork.

Well done, Birch Class – keep up the fantastic work! Have a lovely February half-term break.

ASH CLASS

Ash Class have been very busy with their learning and have used lots of practical experiences to enhance this during the half term. In Science we have been learning about fossils, rocks and soil. We used different foods to make a soil profile. The children loved this and are regularly telling me that they have had sub soil (cocpops) for breakfast! In Art, we have explored Ancient Egyptian art work. We used a thumbnail to explore ancient cave paintings, made a clay model of The Great Sphinx, and created our own collar in the style of Nefertiti. In Geography we have learnt about different settings, services and how the population density differs in rural and urban areas. We then created our own setting. In PE, we have dodged the rain and cold and learnt the skills needed to play netball.

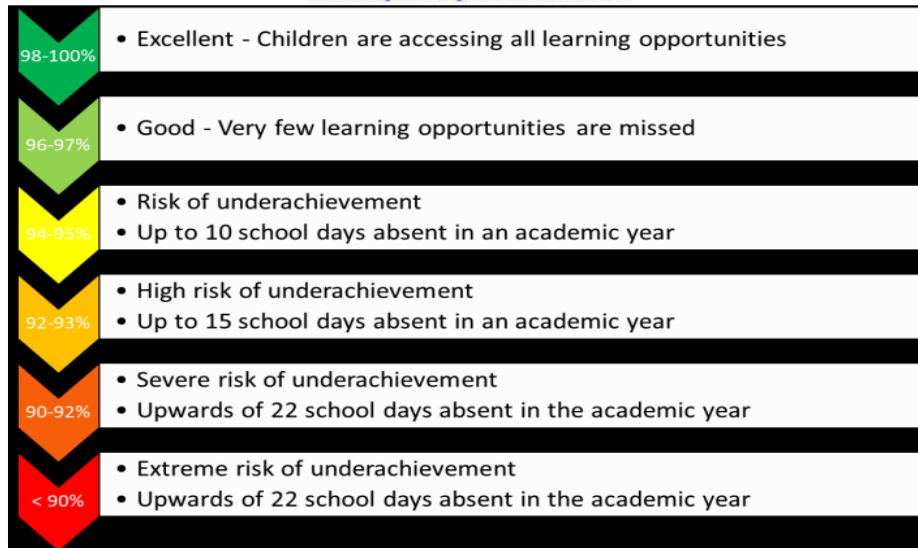
Welcome to our head pupil newsletter!

The importance of good attendance

The Government strives for every pupil to achieve 97% attendance. Every day away from school is a day away from learning and this can have an impact on a child's education and future accomplishments.

We want every child to enjoy school and achieve their potential in education and life beyond. We are always here to talk through any issues and help find solutions. Parents are always a phone call away if a child is too ill to continue their day, please encourage them to try to give the day a go, children often feel much better once they are in class.

The Government has issued new attendance guidance and targets to all schools, you may receive regular texts informing you of the number of days that your child has been absent in a term/year. The Government hope that this personal approach will make parents more aware of how the odd day adds up and help keep you informed.

Vouchers for Free School Meal Eligible Pupils – ENDING

Families who currently receive Edenred vouchers, through the Housing Support Funding scheme (HSF), will receive their last vouchers in March. Any unspent vouchers should be redeemed as soon as possible, the March vouchers must be redeemed within the three-month timeframe to ensure they do not expire.

Although HSF is coming to an end, there will be ongoing support for families in crisis. We would encourage people to visit www.norfolk.gov.uk/costofliving which will be kept up to date with any help on offer.

If families are in difficulty, we would encourage them to contact Family Hub services www.norfolk.gov.uk/familyhubs where there is broader support on debt and welfare rights.

The Big Norfolk Holiday Fun programme is continuing, and the Easter programme will launch in the coming weeks. Families can visit www.norfolk.gov.uk/bignorfolkholidayfun to sign up.

Have your circumstances changed recently?

You may be eligible for Free School Meals.

- Arriving 30 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 19 days a year.

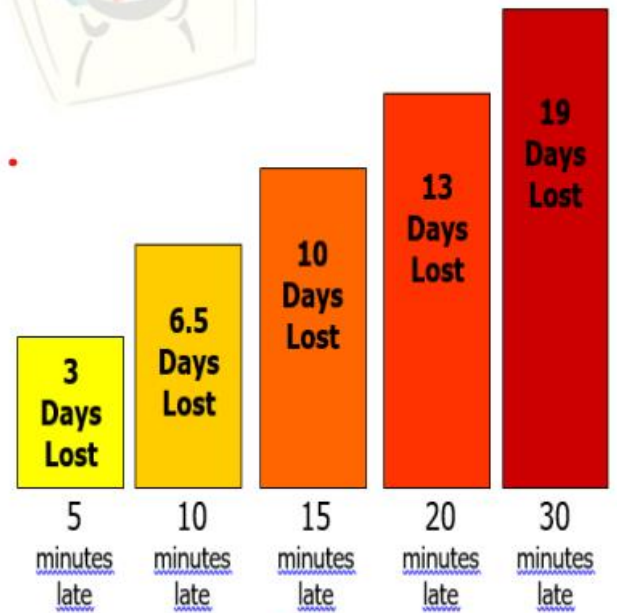
