## Our Learning

### OAK CLASS

Oak class have had a great second part of the spring term. It is wonderful to see so many of them attending the early morning booster sessions; they are all working so hard. They enjoyed finishing their learning in English using 'Call of the Wild' and it was great to watch the film and compare it with the novel. In History, we have developed our knowledge further on World War Two and this was brought to life when we visited Duxford. It was amazing to see their faces as we saw Lancaster bombers up close and listened to the audio recording of the events during the Battle of Britain. The conducted experiments in science lessons to learn about light and shadows and produced some excellent brushstrokes in art lessons with Miss Scott. We have also had lots of extra events going on such as online careers workshops and a visit from 'Leeway' to talk about healthy relationships. I hope Oak class all have a wonderful Easter break.



## Our Learning (cont'd)

### WILLOW CLASS

Happy Easter everyone! Willow class have been incredible this half term and we have made some amazing progress and we have been loving going outside for learning when we can 😊

The Year 1 children have been working on counting in 2, 5, and 10's and exploring capacity and volume. We have been learning how different containers compare in regard to capacity and if the tallest one always holds the most. In English we are learning the model text 'Little Charlie' which we have really enjoyed. The children have completed their independent Hot Writes and I could not be prouder of their progress! Year 1's has enjoyed being architects and understanding that architects design buildings! They have also had the chance to show off their knowledge in their special quizzes! 😊

The Reception children have been doing some lovely exploring outside! They have been learning the Model Text '3 Billy Goats Gruff'. We also had a super fun Music and Movement session where the children were Kings and Queens! They were taught how to be graceful and how to walk into a royal ball with a partner. In knowledge we have been learning all about transport and how we can travel in different ways, the children have loved making cars, trains and planes out of construction equipment! Thank you for your continued support!



## Our Learning (cont'd)

### **BIRCH CLASS**

What a wonderfully busy and productive term it has been! I would like to take a moment to say a huge well done to all of the children for their hard work and enthusiasm. They have approached their learning with great focus and have produced some fantastic work to be proud of.

This half term also included assessment week, and I was incredibly impressed by the resilience shown by every member of Birch Class. It is lovely to see that all of the children have made progress and continue to grow in confidence.

Across the curriculum, the class have continued to deepen their knowledge and curiosity. In science, the children have been exploring forces through a range of exciting experiments, investigating concepts such as push and pull, friction, and air resistance.

In history, the class have been learning about the abolition of the slave trade. They have shown great maturity when discussing the unfair treatment of enslaved people and have explored how the slave trade was eventually abolished. As part of this topic, the children wrote powerful speeches from the perspective of William Wilberforce, arguing for the end of slavery.

In English, we have been focusing on persuasive writing. The children have learnt how to use personal appeal and modal verbs effectively. For their final piece, they wrote persuasive letters to Mr Mackie (from *Cloud Busting*), arguing for a ban on nuts in school. This led to thoughtful discussions about allergies, their potential dangers, and how ingredients in food can sometimes reduce nutritional value.

In music, the children have enjoyed improvising on the glockenspiels and have been learning to identify and discuss the different elements within a variety of songs.

Last week, the children also had great fun taking part in the Friends' Easter egg hunt — a highlight for many!

I have thoroughly enjoyed seeing the children's effort, progress, and enthusiasm this half term. Well done, Birch Class — I hope you all have a wonderful and well-deserved Easter holiday!



## Our Learning (cont'd)

### ASH CLASS

Spring 2 was a short, but very full half term! In English we've learnt the recount of Tortoise and Hare's race, and used this to write our own wonderful piece of writing. In History we've learnt about Henry II, Richard the Lionheart and King John and acted out some of the events that happened during their reign. In Science we have learnt about our bodies; the make up of organs, healthy diets, the role of teeth and the digestive system. In RE we revisited the Easter Story and thought about what was 'good' about Good Friday. We were fortunate to have Reverend Dan visit us and asked him lots of thoughtful questions about Christianity at Easter. As part of our RE work we thought about showing gratitude and love to people around us. The children came up with some wonderful ideas to show their families this - expect lots of cuddles, jokes and cups of tea! We are finishing this term with a trip to Pensthorpe where we will see lots of our science learning about habitats, lifecycles and plant classification in action. Have a lovely break and don't eat too much chocolate!

## Our Learning (cont'd)



### The importance of good attendance

The Government strives for every pupil to achieve 97% attendance. Every day away from school is a day away from learning and this can have an impact on a child's education and future accomplishments.

We want every child to enjoy school and achieve their potential in education and life beyond. We are always here to talk through any issues and help find solutions. Parents are always a phone call away if a child is too ill to continue their day, please encourage them to try to give the day a go, children often feel much better once they are in class.

The Government has issued new attendance guidance and targets to all schools, you may receive regular texts informing you of the number of days that your child has been absent in a term/year. The Government hope that this personal approach will make parents more aware of how the odd day adds up and help keep you informed.

### **Vouchers for Free School Meal Eligible Pupils – ENDING**

Families who currently receive Edenred vouchers, through the Housing Support Funding scheme (HSF), will receive their last vouchers in March. Any unspent vouchers should be redeemed as soon as possible, the March vouchers must be redeemed within the three-month timeframe to ensure they do not expire.

Although HSF is coming to an end, there will be ongoing support for families in crisis. We would encourage people to visit [www.norfolk.gov.uk/costofliving](http://www.norfolk.gov.uk/costofliving) which will be kept up to date with any help on offer.

If families are in difficulty, we would encourage them to contact Family Hub services [www.norfolk.gov.uk/familyhubs](http://www.norfolk.gov.uk/familyhubs) where there is broader support on debt and welfare rights.

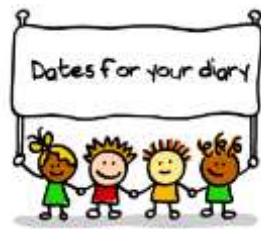
